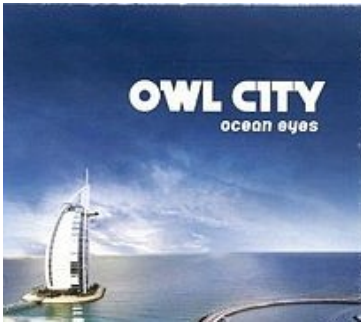




AROUND PHILLY: OWL CITY

If you have never heard of Owl City, which seems extremely doubtful, then I shall tell you about this musical project.

Formed by Adam Young in 2007 in Owatonna, Minnesota, Owl City began as an electronic experiment in his parents' basement.

Through the use of MySpace, Young was able to develop a strong following for his project.

This following caught the attention of presidents at Universal

Republic who then approached Young with a label deal.

After the deal, Owl City released its first full length album, Ocean Eyes, in 2009. One of the album's singles, "Fireflies," topped the charts and is now multi-platinum.

Owl City's live band consists of Daniel Jorgensen on vibes, Hannah Schroeder on cello, Casey Brown on drums, Laura Musten on violin, and Breanne Düren on background vocals and keyboard.

More recently, Owl City has collaborated with Carly Rae Jepsen, singer of the popular "Call Me Maybe," on a new song called "Good Time." And there are plans for a fourth album in the near future.

This Saturday is the Red Bull Flug Tag in Philadelphia. Come down to the Camden Waterfront at 1pm to join fellow crash enthusiasts in watching these

amazing homemade machines attempt to fly off a thirty foot ramp.

For those who have managed to live under a rock for about twenty years, let me fill you in on what this great event is.

Flug Tag is an annual competition with the first event being held in 1991 in Vienna. At the event, competitors bring their own self-made, human-powered

flying machines. These machines are then launched off a pier into the sea with the majority of them rarely being successful in flight.

So far, the longest flight on record is 229 feet set at an event in Germany.
